### PRESIDENT'S CORNER: By John Sabina

Our 30<sup>th</sup> woodcarving show will be held on Saturday, March 20 and Sunday, March 21, 2009. This is our big event of the carving year and our chance to demonstrate to the carving community our friendliness, organizational capabilities, and carving talent. Our annual show requires a huge commitment in terms of both human and



financial capital. Very little information about the 2010 Show was available at the November meeting. I am pleased to report that the early planning is on track. Show co-chairs, Mike LePage and Bill Wolfe have selected a theme of "country living." Fliers should be available at the December meeting.

A large number of our members have not paid their dues for this year. Mike had requested an individual to serve as show chairman with his planning crew providing complete support on the grimy details in the background. Not one single volunteer even inquired. Thus, I feel that it is time to reaffirm our club's commitment to our show. Each member has to ask himself or herself what the show means to them. We can't have the great show that has been our tradition without everyone rowing hard. Worker sign up sheets will be available at the December membership meeting. This is the first way that you can acknowledge your commitment. Please sign-up now! Some people like to wait until the actual show to volunteer. I would much rather have a full worker list early and have to make last minute changes as required than to worry about filling in a blank list much closer to the show. So, please step forward and be counted.

Show workers are needed for three distinct time periods, before the show weekend, show weekend before and after hours, and during the show. Before the show weekend involves **PUBLICITY** (This job entails making the carving community and general public aware of the show,) **DOOR PRIZE COORDINATOR** (This individual will pass out blanks to interested carvers and collect the finished door prizes before the show,) and **CARVING DEMO COORDINATOR** (This individual will line up presenters for various one-hour demonstrations during the show.)

Show weekend before and after hours involves SHOW SET UP ON FRIDAY (People are needed to tape down extension cords, pass out packets and the like,) HOSPITALITY (Set up coffee and donuts for the vendors in the spare kitchen on both Saturday and Sunday,) COURTESY (Assist Vendors unloading their vehicles on Saturday morning and assist participants in taking their materials to their vehicles Sunday afternoon,) BREAKFAST TABLE SET UP (Saturday after the show closes set up tables and additional chairs and cover tables for the Sunday breakfast,) and

**SECURITY – SATURDAY NIGHT** (two or more persons spend the night at the hall and make sure that no one enters the hall without permission and let Lions Club members into hall early on Sun morning for the preparation of exhibitor breakfast.)

Jobs during the show hours include TICKET SELLERS-FRONT DOOR (Take money, sell entry tickets and give door prize tickets to each person entering show,) PEOPLES CHOICE (Take in the carvings on Saturday for this competition and give out ballots for voting on both days,) CLUB TABLE (Pass out club information and door prizes,) CLUB RAFFLE TABLE (Sell tickets for donated carvings,) and SECURITY/HOSPITALITY (Club members who will walk thru and make sure vendors get a break from their table as needed.)

So, our show gives members plenty of opportunities to show their support and pitch-in. Let's get the sign-up started at the December meeting.

### **MWCA Update:** By Bill Phillips

The Michigan Wood Carvers Association has been invited to display carvings, wood burnings and intarsia at the Dow Art & Science Museum in Midland, MI 1801 West St. Andrew St. Midland MI. 48640 starting May 29 thru Aug 28, 2010.

If you would like to participate please print & fill out the application which is on the Dow web site at <a href="www.mcfta.org">www.mcfta.org</a>. Take a photo of the carving, put your name along with a rough size of the carving (on the back of the photo) so they will make sure they have the right size museum display pedestal for your carving. They are accepting applications now so send them in today or before May 1, 2010 which is the cutoff date for applications. Carvings should arrive starting May 17th thru 22nd, 2010. They are inviting all blue ribbon winners from any club show for the past two years to join in a juried (judged) competition. Anyone wishing to enter the competition must be a MWCA member and won a blue ribbon within the past two years to qualify that particular carving into the competition.

They will also be inviting all MWCA members to show (same application & photo info requirements apply) one carving completed in the past two years in an open (display only) category. Participants will only be able to enter one carving in either category. You will also have the opportunity to sell your carving if you so desire. There is no cost involved for displaying or the juried competition unless you would like to sell your carving, if so the museum charges a 30% fee for their services.

The Metro Carvers of Michigan, as a woodcarving club, has an unprecedented opportunity to show the rest of the state the artistic talents of our members. As you may have heard at the November meeting, the Alden B. Dow Museum, in Midland, will be featuring works by the members of the Michigan Wood Carvers Association. We, as Michigan's largest woodcarving club, should be able provide a substantial amount of quality work for this exhibition. At the November meeting a number of Metro members volunteered to help organize our clubs participation in this exhibit. In this effort, one of the jobs the volunteers will do will be to gather the names of fellow members who have, in the past, exhibited quality, artistic work. These works can be carvings, intarsia or wood burnings. The selected members will be asked if they would like to exhibit their work at the museum. If so, they will need to package their own works and include labeling on the box to identify themselves and the carving so that the same box may be reused for safe return. If necessary, the club volunteers will arrange for the pickup, delivery and return of the selected items. Again, this is a great opportunity for our membership. However, we do need help from you, our members. We need fellow members to step forward and to help make this a successful "Metro Carvers of Michigan" exhibit. There will also be other state clubs displaying their quality works, so, we will be competing against their talented members. We need to show them that the "Metro Carvers of Michigan" is not just a large organization, but an organization of imaginative and artistic creators of wood based art. Please talk to one of the club officers to find out how you can help in making this a successful exhibit for the Metro Carvers. There will be two exhibitions, one open and one juried.
