The sixth annual Carve Fest was held in Washington Township on September 24th and 25th. The purpose of this event is to get people carving, learning and sharing. Carve Fest VI would have to be considered a major success. Our attendance was down a small amount when compared to Carve Fest 5. Friday's attendance was 95 this year compared to 94 last year. However, Saturday had 84 people sign in versus 111 in 2009. We had ten simultaneous sessions this year compared to a maximum of nine previously.

Sixteen club members who served as project leaders made the ten carving and burning projects possible. These volunteer instructors are the most important ingredients to making Carve Fest work. Instructors sharing their ideas and techniques are what generate participation. There will be a Carve Fest VII! The details, while not yet defined, will be revealed as they unfold. Thanks to all who participated. Please plan on joining us again next year.


#### **MWCA Update:** By Pat Murphy
